Binghamton Mayoral Candidate Rich David Filed Petitions This Afternoon At Broome County Board of Elections -David Secured More Than Twice The Signatures Necessary To Appear On Ballot-

(CITY OF BINGHAMTON, NY) Binghamton Mayoral Candidate Rich David today personally delivered his signed petitions to the Broome County Board of Elections. David, along with dedicated volunteers from the Friends To Elect Rich David, secured 732 signatures, more than two times the number necessary to appear on the ballot as the Republican candidate.

"From the day I announced my intentions to run for Mayor I pledged to run a positive, grass roots, issue-oriented campaign, and over the course of the last several weeks I have met with hundreds of residents who are very supportive about my candidacy," said David. "While I secured signatures from registered Republicans, I've had countless conversations with Independents, Conservatives, Democrats and many others who are equally supportive and enthusiastic about my campaign and vision for the City. The common message I received from residents of all parties is that change is needed and change is needed now."

Even through the petition process has come to a close, David will continue to go door to door to all residents citywide to listen to what they have to say, talk about his vision for the City and explain why he is the most qualified candidate for the job. David will also continue to host a series of fundraisers and get-togethers to connect with Binghamton residents.
